Preamble:

This course is meant for those who have basic knowledge of Sanskrit language and who want to pursue higher studies in Sanskrit. Course gives a vision to a learner to understand and interpret different styles of Sanskrit language and different subjects dealt in it, like Veda, grammar, Indian philosophy, poetry, poetics, etymology, ancient sciences, Ramayana, Mahabharata etc. Students have to learn all compulsory papers in the first year, whereas they have to opt for specialization in the second year of their course. We offer Darshana (Indian Philosophy) and Vyakarana (Grammar) as specialization subjects.

Eligibility: B.A. Sanskrit or Diploma in Sanskrit from any of the recognized institutes. Those who have not cleared either of these courses, will have to clear the entrance examination for qualifying for M.A. Sanskrit.
